## **Summer Camp Goals**

One Kids Place is dedicated to creating a positive, welcoming, and engaging recreation experience for everyone.

To help make camp fun and safe for all, we ask campers to:

- Treat staff and fellow campers with kindness and respect
- Join in, cooperate, and give camp activities a try
- Take care of camp rules, facilities, and equipment

On the first day of camp, our friendly camp staff will work together with campers to help create, understand, and reinforce camp rules and expectations—because the best camp experiences happen when everyone has a voice!

## **Staff**

Our summer camp staff are thoughtfully selected for their experience, skills, enthusiasm, and genuine love of working with children.

Before camp begins, all staff participate in mandatory training covering leadership, teamwork, motivation, parent communication, policies and procedures, as well as detailed camp program planning and expectations—so they're fully prepared to create a safe, positive, and fun camp experience for every camper.

## **Supervision**

We want you to feel confident knowing your child is in a safe, caring, and supportive environment. We ensure close and attentive supervision at all times by maintaining appropriate staff-to-child ratios for each age group and completing regular head counts throughout the day—especially during transitions—to keep everyone safe and accounted for.





## **Ages**

Children must meet the minimum age requirement as of the first day of the camp program. Age requirements are clearly outlined in each program description.

Our camp offers two age groups:

- Ages 6–11
- Ages 12–18 (or up to age 21 if still attending school)

## **Camp Location**

All camp adventures will kick off from our North Bay location at 400 McKeown Avenue.

## **Safety Measures**

- Headcounts are taken multiple times throughout the day
- Low camper-to-leader ratios for attentive supervision
- Increased staffing during community outings
- Designated camp spaces for organized programming
- Clearly marked sign-in and sign-out locations
- A balanced mix of outdoor activities (weather permitting)

## **Camp dates and extended care options**

Camps are offered from July 6<sup>th</sup> to August 21<sup>st</sup> 2026.

There will be no camp on Monday, August 3<sup>rd</sup> 2026 (Civic Holiday)

- Camps operate Monday to Friday from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm.
- Parents/guardians requiring extended care may drop off their child no earlier than 8:00 am and may pick up their child no later than 4:30 pm.

## **Camper pick up, drop off and safe arrival**

All campers must have adult supervision during morning drop off and afternoon pick up. Please ensure that regular chaperones and emergency contacts are up to date on your child's registration form as well as sign in/sign out sheet.

Individuals will be required to show government issued identification upon pick up. Campers will not be allowed to leave the program without informed consent from parent/guardian.

## **Camp fees**

To provide the high level of support and care that makes our summer camps so special, there is an associated cost. To help keep camp as accessible as possible, each family is responsible for \$300.00 per camper, per week, with the remainder generously subsidized thanks to community support. For our high needs camps, each family is responsible for \$1000.00 per camper, per week, with the remainder generously subsidized thanks to community support. There is a half day option for our high needs camps.

We are committed to ensuring every child has the opportunity to participate in camp, regardless of financial circumstance. If your family requires additional financial assistance, we encourage you to discuss this at the time of registration. One Kids Place camps may be supported through programs such as Special Services at Home, Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities, AccessOAP, and the OKP Family Support Program. Please note that each family is responsible for a minimum fee of \$100.00 per camper, per week.





## **Illness protocol**

If your child becomes ill during camp hours, we will notify a parent or guardian immediately so they can be picked up.

To keep all campers safe and healthy, please do not send your child to camp if they have a communicable disease (such as pink eye, chicken pox, or an infection) or are showing any illness symptoms. Your child can return once they are no longer contagious.

## **What to bring to camp**

To enhance your camper's experience, please remember to bring the following items in a bag/backpack with your child each day and clearly mark your child's name on the items sent.

- Hat and sunscreen (apply at home and pack in bag)
- Morning & Afternoon snack
- Lunch (no nuts please)
- Refillable water bottle
- Bathing suit, towel, water shoes (optional) – as required.
- Closed toe/heel shoes – Open toe sandals and crocs are not appropriate for camp activities.
- Weather appropriate clothing for outdoor activities.
- Extra set of clothing – in a separate small bag, within your backpack.





## **What to wear to camp**

Campers should wear comfortable, weather- and activity-appropriate clothing. Camp days are active—running, jumping, and playing makes for the best experience! Dressing in layers is a good idea, as indoor spaces can be cooler than the outdoors.

Please talk with your child about taking care of their belongings. One Kids Place is not responsible for lost, missing, or stolen items.

To help prevent lost items, please label your camper’s clothing and personal belongings. We also recommend that campers leave valuables at home.

## **What to leave at home**

Camp is all about making friends, trying new things, and having a blast! To keep the fun going and avoid lost treasures, we ask that valuables, electronics, and toys stay at home. If your camper does bring them, they’ll get to keep them safe in their backpack until the end of the day.

## **Snacks and Lunches**

- Pack lunches and snacks that won’t spoil, and include at least two drinks—refillable bottles are best since campers are active most of the day.
- To keep all campers safe, all camps are “NUT AWARE”. Please avoid sending foods that contain or may contain nuts. Strict safety guidelines are followed to protect everyone.
- Remind your camper not to share food with other campers to help keep everyone safe and healthy.





## **Camper conduct while attending camp**

Our camp staff works hard to create a summer filled with caring, respect, and understanding. To help make camp fun and safe for everyone, we ask campers to follow these simple expectations:

- Be kind and respectful of others' feelings and belongings
- Work together and cooperate with your fellow campers
- Listen to and follow directions from your group leaders
- Stay with your group at all times
- Keep hands, feet, and words to yourself (no fighting, yelling, hitting, or swearing)
- Tell a group leader if something or someone is bothering you
- Clean up after yourself and take care of camp spaces
- Come to camp ready to learn, play, and have fun

We appreciate your support in discussing and reinforcing these expectations with your child to help ensure a positive camp experience for all.

## **Behaviour Guidelines**

One Kids Place recognizes its responsibility to support campers and appropriately address disruptive behaviour. These guidelines apply to all children and youth participating in recreation programs, including summer camps.

- Staff use positive, supportive, consistent, and proactive approaches that focus on encouragement and logical consequences.
- Disruptive behaviour is addressed fairly and consistently using progressive behaviour management strategies.
- We ask families to share any relevant family or behavioural concerns so staff can best support each participant. While every effort will be made to accommodate individual needs, One Kids Place reserves the right to withdraw a participant if their behaviour poses a risk to their own safety, or the safety of other participants, staff, or property.
- Parents and guardians will be kept informed and communication will be provided should any situation arise.

Our staff are committed to providing an excellent camp experience for your child. If you have any questions or concerns that need to be addressed, we encourage you to speak with staff in a respectful and constructive manner.
